Around the Traps

Insurance Update

The insurance claim resulting from the December storms and water inundation has been finalised and the club has received the settlement. Throughout the process, our tenacious Vice-President, Brian Reid, has been in constant communication with a variety of representatives of the insurance company, the assessors and the club's insurance broker. The amount of paper work involved was mind boggling. Anton Motha & Col Crittenden spent hours inspecting and categorising the damaged equipment, ready for the assessor. There were obviously other club members involved in the process, but the broad shoulders mentioned above deserve the gratitude of all club members.

Equipment Replacement

Now that the insurance is settled, the committee has been hard at work procuring replacement equipment. Some of the traps will be coming from overseas, so there will be inevitable delays in their delivery. Some traps were available locally and the club has already ordered six Bowman Sporting Clays traps. Ground No.3 currently has a Laporte Twinlap trap on loan from Bronzewing Aust. We have ordered two of the same model traps and will return the borrowed one when the new items arrive from France. The intention is to have DTL up and running on grounds 2 & 3 as soon as possible after the new traps arrive. Orders have also been placed for new Canterbury microphones and a variety of other ancillary components, such as cables, etc.

Kitchen Renovations Working Bee

Our kitchen upgrade grant application was successful and work is scheduled to start immediately after the March DTL competition. There will be a working be on Sunday the 17th of March to dismantle and remove the existing kitchen. It would be great to see as many volunteers as possible on site to help. Work will start bright and early on Sunday the 17th of March, so wear your green work gear if you must (St Patrick's day!), but please come to help.

Toilet Grant Application Successful

We missed out in the first round of the Federal Government's Community Sports Infrastructure Grants programme. Heart break turned to joy, though, when we were successful in the second round, with Senator Bridget McKenzie, the Federal Minister for Sport, visiting the club to personally confirm the grant. Anton, Brian & Col have been flat out chasing plans, quotes and council approval and it seems that we are close to finalising those. Details of the actual structure and its location will be posted on the club's website and Facebook as soon as the council planning approval is received.

Sport North East This Girl Can Programme

Brian Reid developed a plan for our club to partner Sport North East in VicHealth's This Girl Can programme, aimed at encouraging female participation in sports and activities. Special Learn Clay Target Shooting sessions were run at our club on Tuesday evenings from the start of February until mid-March. Numbers varied, but one session had 12 participants. Ages also varied, with the youngest being 12 and the oldest in her 70s. Each shooter was teamed up with an experienced club member for individual coaching and all of the participants managed to break at least a few targets.
