Environmental Policy

The Wangaratta Clay Target Club operates as a multi-discipline shooting range for shotgun shooters. Accordingly, a number of environmental considerations form an essential part of the club's operations. Those considerations include the lead contained in the ammunition, the plastic waste from spent ammunition and the material from which the targets themselves are made.

The Wangaratta Clay Target Club has made a commitment to minimising the risk of the above listed factors and has put in place measures to restrict their environmental effects to the club's premises and surrounds.

To maintain the club's commitment to minimising environmental impacts, the club will;

- Comply with all relevant legal requirements and any other environmental guidelines stipulated by the governing bodies to which the club is affiliated (ACTA, SCA).
- Abide by all requirements included in the club's Environmental Management Plan.
- Ensure that all bi-products of shooting activities (Lead pellets, plastic wads, target material) remain within the club's physical boundaries.
- Periodically remove excess target material and plastic wad litter.
- Ensure that materials used at the club, especially targets, are, as far as practicable, environmentally friendly.
- Reduce waste and minimise the consumption of all resources. Maintain and encourage recycling practices.
- Promulgate information and educate members and visitors on the importance of conducting our sport in an environmentally responsible manner.

The Wangaratta Clay Target Club will periodically review this policy and upgrade it as required to ensure the improvement of the club's environmental performance.
